

Glendale Fire Cadets

Accountability Rules & Regulations

Required hours

All Glendale Fire Department Cadets are required to volunteer a minimum of 24hrs per month if they are also involved in the Glendale Fire Department Crisis Response program they are required 36hrs per month.

Items that qualify for time use

- Cadet Meetings
- Cadet Drills
- Ride a Long time at assigned station
- City of Glendale Events that Cadets participate in
- Union Events
- Any event that is introduced by GFF for Cadets to Participate in

All hours must be submitted to FF in charge of time tracking Ruben Florez (rplorez@glendaleaz.com) by the 5th of the month. If hours are not sent in to proper designated person you will be given no hours for the month. If you have 2 consecutive months or 3 total months in a calendar year without fulfilling your hours you can be removed from the program.

Goal: To keep the program moving in a positive manner and continue to have Cadets interacting with community and firefighters to always continue learning and building a knowledge base to become a career firefighter

3 strike policy

All Glendale Fire Dept. Cadet Members are responsible for being at all Cadet Meetings and Drills which are both held once a month. If that member can not attend those functions he or she MUST contact the Designated Firefighter David Colson (dcolson@glendaleaz.com) in charge of tracking their excused absence. By email primary or phone if need be. If the member fails to do this on the second miss will be contacted by Fire Dept. member. If a 3rd miss happens member may be dismissed from the program.

Goal: To hold people accountable for what they said during their interviews and maintain the reputation of the program.

Mandatory Monthly Meetings

It will be mandatory to attend at least 7 of the monthly meetings each year and all others must be excused absences.

Goal: to make sure that all Cadets are on the same page with events, changes, and workings of the program and ensure accountability.

EMT Certification

All Glendale Fire Cadets are required to be enrolled into and successfully complete EMT Certification by the very next semester after being accepted into Glendale Fire Cadet Program. If you do not enroll or complete EMT program at local college you may be dismissed from the program.

Goal: To make all Cadets eligible for career in fire service and provide them with the knowledge base to use and fine tune skills while riding on assigned GFD apparatus by Cadet Program.
